5 POLICE REPORT

Through the Clerk, PCSO Huddleston reported that in the last two months four crimes were dealt with by the police: a Public Order offence (neighbour dispute), an arrest for driving with excess alcohol, the unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle and a complaint involving sheep worrying. Enquiries are being undertaken by the Coastguard to establish the ownership of a dinghy found drifting at Port Navas.

Members of the Force with responsibilities for Constantine wish everyone a very Happy Christmas.

6 CORNWALL COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

CCllr Hatton reported that

 officers from the Cornwall Council Environmental Heritage Trust removed the arms and the sleeve from the historic fingerpost at High Cross for renovation purposes. It has been suggested that future renovation projects might be the subject of communication between departments

- Cornwall Council has agreed to impose a rise of 1.97% in the Council Tax demanded from residents. It is felt that this will be sufficient to steady the ship at present, but there are predictions of a continuing decline in the grant from Central Government
- a survey of Town and Parish Councils reveals that two thirds of them believe that the Community Networks should be discontinued. However, there would be greater support for them if they had more powers and a devolved budget. The Falmouth and Penryn Network has not met since July 2013
- there is a meeting of the full Council on January 14 to agree the Local Plan: in the meanwhile, soundings are being taken at central government level to determine whether or not the figure of 42,000 new homes in the county, as proposed in the Local Plan, will be acceptable
- Ward Members who have residents attending Helston School are seeking ways of attracting central government funding to refurbish 'C' block (which is currently not fit for purpose).

Recreation Ground (report from the JuMP Advisory Committee)

Mr Montag reported that he has now chaired the JuMP Advisory Committee for just over a year. In that time and in brief, the group

- with the help of Brian Jorey and half a dozen young people from the village, has overseen the repair of the gazebo
- has started work on preparing the ground to receive the Youth Club pavilion (again with the help of young people from the village)
- ran a number of workshops (the subject of which was the design of the play area) during the school summer holidays
- has consulted Year 6 pupils at the school about the design of the proposed play area
- would like authority to employ a professional playground designer who will incorporate the children's ideas into the final ground plan (Following discussion, the Chairman proposed and it was agreed that it is essential to seek professional advice concerning the lay-out of the play area.)
- has raised about £56,000 both from residents and grant making organisations
- will be in a position to make recommendations to the Parish Council at the next meeting
- and expects at least six items of new equipment to be in place by the summer of 2014.

Speaking on behalf of the Parish Council, the Chairman said that what the committee has achieved is quite remarkable and that the community owed them all a huge vote of thanks.
