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Minutes of the Ordinary Meeting of Constantine Parish Council held on Thursday March 16, 2023 at 7.30pm in The Vestry.

In the initial absence of Cllr P.Carter (the Chairman), Cllr Bolt assumed the chair and welcomed members and visitors to the meeting.

PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

With reference to PA23/00600 Worden Crownmark Developments – Outline planning permission with some matters reserved for the proposed construction of a single dwelling – land adj to 3 Comfort Wartha, members of the public present raised both the following issues and others

- bearing in mind the number of times similar applications to build on this site have been submitted and refused in recent years, this application is a waste of public time and money
- the plans (and in particular the photographs) which form part of this application are misleading
- despite what is claimed, construction on this site would have an enormous and adverse impact on neighbouring residents
- the recent pre-emptive clearance of woodland may be illegal (contractors were instructed to clear the land all the way down to Bosahan Wood but left the site when the strength of opinion against such action became obvious)
- the Cornwall Wildlife Trust suggests that the site as a whole acts as a natural corridor for wildlife access to Bosahan Wood: neighbouring residents report frequently seeing many different sorts of wildlife including bats, deer, hedgehogs and a heron. A report suggests that it might be a preferred site for nesting otters
- a recent initiative to access funding for stewardship over Bosahan Woods (which includes the area contractors were instructed to clear) over the next ten years is close to success, but ultimately is dependent on the inclusion of this corridor of land

With reference to PA23/01418 Mr W.Eastham and Ms P.Fisher – Change of use of land to equestrian, construction of sand school and storage building, and retention and extension of stables – land North of Rose Cottage, The Level, Members of the public present raised both the following issues and others

- the application is retrospective in nature
- the large, illegally-erected stable building has been erected with wanton disregard for planning procedures
- the adverse effect of construction on the wild-life of the area is already obvious
- the construction of the stables and the sand school will have an unwelcome visual impact on the area as a whole
- applications for buildings on this site have twice been refused
- the entrance off the road and onto the site has long been recognised by the Planning Authority as representing a danger to highway users

The applicants stated that they wanted simply to keep horses on land they owned and that, having been advised that planning permission would take some while to come through, had decided to go ahead and to seek retrospective permission. They applogised for causing their neighbours any distress.

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1 TO RECEIVE APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Cllr E.Nicholls, Cllr Mrs T.Thomson and Cllr R.Wickins sent their apologies for absence. Cllr Andrew proposed, Cllr Painter seconded, all others in favour that these apologies should be accepted.

2 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

in items on the agenda

Cllr Andrew declared a non-disclosable interest in agenda item 10 (the request for financial help from the Cottage Garden Society).

There were no declarations of gifts of a value greater than £50.

3 CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

Cllr Andrew proposed, Cllr Mrs Scott seconded, Cllr Jeffery being absent from the meeting abstained, all others in favour that, with the hand-written amendment, the minutes of the Ordinary Meeting held on Thursday February 16, 2023 should be adopted as a true record and the Chairman signed them as such.

4 MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES BUT NOT INCLUDED ON THIS AGENDA

Cllr Painter reminded members that he had requested that the issue of road safety, particularly at the point where feeder roads enter the village, should be made an agenda item. He further reported that, as agreed, members of the Making Space for Nature group had tidied the verge between the recreation ground and Trebarvah Road.

Cllr P.Carter joined the meeting at this point

5 CORNWALL COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Cllr Bastin reported that

- the Falmouth and Penryn Community Network Panel has now met for the last time
- however, the same partner members will meet again in September under the new label of The Community Area Partnership
- in addition to the existing highways scheme, this partnership will have access to some £300,000 from the Levelling Up scheme for capital project funding under a number of headings including community infrastructure and bio-diversity
- moreover, Community Facilitation money (which is designed to finance a dedicated team to work up capital schemes to the point at which grant funding can be sought) will become available
- the Cornwall and Isles of Scilly Local Nature Preservation Summit 2023 will take place on May 19 between 9.00am and 4.00pm at Heartlands, Pool. He recommended this organisation and the summit to all those present

In answer to questions, CCllr Bastin said that

- whether or not the new Community Area Partnership will meet on-line or face-to-face has yet to be decided
- the result of the consultation on the so-called devolution deal has yet to be published, but will need to be in the public domain before the next Cabinet meeting (when the deal is due to be discussed and a decision taken) at the end of March
- bearing in mind the lack of water resources and the influx of summer visitors, he would pass on a question about whether or not there are any plans to restrict numbers of holiday-makers. The current suggestion that desalination plants might be built relies entirely on the availability of huge amounts of energy

In view of the considerable number of visitors who had earlier demonstrated a particular interest in two of the planning applications due to be considered, Cllr Painter proposed, Cllr Andrew seconded and it was agreed to consider agenda item 8 Planning at this point

8 PLANNING MATTERS

To consider observations concerning the following planning applications

PA23/00600 Worden Crownmark Developments – Outline planning permission with some matters reserved for the proposed construction of a single dwelling – land adj to 3 Comfort Wartha, Constantine. Cllr A.Carter proposed, Cllr Andrew seconded it was agreed to return the following observation Constantine Parish Council believes that the Section 52 Agreement in respect of this land still serves a useful purpose in protecting against the loss of an area of public open space which remains highly prized by local residents and which has not been demonstrated to be surplus to requirements. The retention of the Agreement would meet the tests set out under paragraphs 98 and 99 of the National Planning Policy Framework 2019. Furthermore, the proposal is contrary to Policies 13 (Development standards), 16 (Health and well-being) and 25 (Green Infrastructure) of the Cornwall Local Plan Strategic Policies 2010-2030. Constantine Parish Council requests the Planning Authority to refuse permission for development because

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the S152 agreement signed on August 28, 1985 by the then Director and Secretary of Crownmark Developments Limited of Crown House, 2 Crowndale, London SE19 2NQ remains of value.

PA23/01418 Mr W.Eastham and Ms P.Fisher – Change of use of land to equestrian, construction of sand school and storage building, and retention and extension of stables – land North of Rose Cottage, The Level. Cllr P.Carter proposed, Cllr Andrew seconded and with two abstentions it was agreed to return the following observation Constantine Parish Council does not support this application. The existing, unlawfully constructed, large stable block represents substantial and unwelcome sporadic development which has a detrimental visual impact on the landscape at this point and the construction of a sand-school on the site will only add to that impact. The proposed material change of use from agricultural to equestrian with the associated requirement for the use of a motor vehicle for daily access throughout the year and the paraphernalia necessary for the husbandry of horses is also inappropriate in this location. Finally, the Parish Council notes that in 2002 Kerrier District Council deemed that "the access to the site is at a point where the visibility available to drivers of emerging vehicles is restricted" and that "the use of such an access is likely to give rise to danger to highway users".

PA23/01629 Mr Nicholls – Proposed replacement dwelling – Lowenna, Brill. Cllr P.Carter proposed Cllr Andrew seconded and it was agreed to return the following observation *The Applicant has been a well-liked and well-respected member of Constantine Parish Council for so many years that the Council believes it would be inappropriate to make any observations concerning this application.*

PA23/01699 Messrs R.A. and R.S.Bassett – Construction of a modern steel portal-frame agricultural building – Trevassack Farm, Constantine. Cllr A.Carter proposed, Cllr Painter seconded and with two abstentions it was agreed to return the following observation *Constantine Parish Council supports this application*.

6 PARISH MATTERS

Maintenance of the Historic Finger-Posts

Cllr Jeffery reported that obtaining quotations for on-site shot-blasting of the finger-posts is proving problematic: he will keep trying.

The Coronation of HM King Charles III

Members considered a proposal to present a commemorative gift to local school-children. Following considerable discussion, during the course of which it was noted that a mug represents more of a lasting historical marker of the occasion than perhaps a medal might, Cllr Jeffery proposed, Cllr A.Carter seconded with one member against and one member abstaining that the Parish Council will fund the purchase of commemorative mugs.

7 PARISH COUNCIL MATTERS

Insurance Policy

Members reviewed the terms of Constantine Parish Council's Insurance Policy and considered an invitation from A.J.Gallagher to renew insurance cover with Hiscox in the sum of £1,930.33 Following discussion, Cllr Painter proposed, Cllr Andrew seconded, all others in favour to renew Constantine Parish Council's insurance with Hiscox through A,L,Gallagher in the sum of £1,930.00

Members considered a request from Mrs Kate Edwards-Shaw (the Pre-School Manager) for permission to use the Recreation Field to host the Pre-School Sports Day on the afternoon of Wednesday June 28th. 10 FINANCIAL MATTERS
