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Minutes of the Ordinary Meeting of Constantine Parish Council held on Thursday September 19, 2023 at 7.30pm in The Vestry.

The Chairman welcomed members and visitors to the meeting.

PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

Mr Boekestein asked a number of questions concerning the future of the Church Hall. In particular, the Council was able to state that

- as agreed, the community will be asked to make the decision as to whether or not the Parish Council may enter into negotiations with the vendor for the purchase of the Church Hall, car parks and green space
- a costed plan will be available for the community to view before residents make that decision. (However, it was noted that this plan will, of necessity, reflect current costs)
- if, for whatever reason, the purchase does not go ahead, next year's precept will have the element, which currently reflects repayment of the Public Works Loans Board, removed
- if the purchase does go ahead, the element reflecting the repayment of the Public Works Loans Board will, subject to no further rises in the base bank interest rate, remain broadly similar.

1 TO RECEIVE APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

CCllr Bastin and Cllr Mrs Scott sent their apologies for absence. Cllr Mrs Thomson proposed, Cllr Bolt seconded all others in favour that their apologies should be accepted.

3 CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

Cllr Andrew proposed, Cllr Bolt seconded, Cllr Jeffrey who was absent from the last meeting abstained and it was agreed that the minutes of the Ordinary Meeting held on Thursday July 20, 2023 are a true record and the Chairman signed them as such.

4 MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES BUT NOT INCLUDED ON THIS AGENDA

A question concerning the agreed replacement of the safety matting and its colour was asked. The Clerk sent round a paper describing the matting and the colours available and a colour was chosen. The Clerk was asked to instruct SWPSI to go ahead and replace the matting.

5 CORNWALL COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

In the absence of CCllr Bastin there was no report.

6 PARISH MATTERS

The War Memorial

The Chairman asked members to consider repainting the names of the fallen on the War Memorial in the Churchyard. Following a short discussion, Cllr Painter proposed, Cllr Andrew seconded and it was agreed to have the names repainted. The Clerk was also asked to arrange for the Memorial to be cleaned.

The 80th Anniversary of D-Day

Councillors considered ways in which to commemorate the 80th Anniversary of D-Day on June 6, 2024. Having reminded members that the King had asked that, rather than lighting beacons to celebrate his coronation they should instead be lit to commemorate this historic occasion. Cllr Nicholls proposed, Cllr Bolt seconded and it was agreed to remember the event in this way. It was further noted that Mrs Tracey Clowes had expressed an interest in coordinating further suitable arrangements.

The Green Space under the Trees

Members considered the purchase of a bench for the green space under the trees. Following discussion, Cllr Wickins proposed, Cllr Mrs Thomson seconded and it was agreed to purchase and install a bench on the space under the trees with a maximum budget of £600 Following further discussion, Cllr Nicholls proposed, Cllr Andrew seconded to site a new litter-bin on the same area.

Ponjeravah to Bridge and on to Well Lane: Footpath/Cycleway connectivity plan

Cllr Painter sought the Council's approval to seek funding from the Community Capacity Fund to finance a feasibility study to create a cycleway between Ponjeravah, the village and Trewardrevah and between Bowling Green and Bridge using existing PRoWs and permissive routes. Considerable discussion ensued, following which Cllr Painter proposed that the scheme as a whole should be pursued. This proposal was unsupported. Cllr Mrs Deering proposed an amendment to Cllr Painter's proposal that the route between Bowling Green and Bridge should be pursued and this proposal was agreed. However, yet more discussion followed, during the course of which it was noted that, should an application for funding for this particular scheme prove successful, it is likely that any further scheme put forward by Constantine Parish Council would be ineligible for funding from the same source. It was agreed to consider the matter again at the next meeting.

Maintenance of the Historic Finger-Posts

Members noted that the Brill finger-post has been shot-blasted and powder-coated in white and awaits collection at Cllr Nicholls' yard. Cllr Jeffrey will collect the post and deliver it to Cllr Mrs Scott, who has agreed to paint the lettering. Once this has been done, Cllr Jeffrey will again collect the post and then reinstate it at the corner in Brill. It was noted that shot-blasting and powder-coating will cost some £250 and that new fingers (from Irons Bros) are currently costed out at just over £600 each. Once the Brill finger-post has been reinstated and the resulting costs settled, restoration of the posts at Mount View and Trevase will be considered.

7 PLANNING APPLICATIONS AND DECISIONS

Members noted the following observations returned using delegated powers during the summer recess

PA23/5269 Ms E.Sampson – Retrospective application for the erection of a barn – Agricultural Building, Lestraynes Lane, Rame. This application was returned marked *Constantine Parish Council supports this application*.

PA23/05702 Mr D.Handley – To construct a single agricultural implement shed – Well Farm, Polwheveral. This application was returned marked Constantine Parish Council does not support this application. There is a notable absence of demonstrable need for the proposed agricultural barn. Furthermore, its proposed location, its size and the use of materials will have an unfavourable visual impact on the immediately adjoining AONB. Constantine Parish Council requests the Planning Authority to refuse permission for development.

PA23/05726 Mr Horlick – Application for a Lawful Development Certificate for a Proposed Placement of Caravan /Log Cabin within the residential curtilage of the property for ancillary purposes – 13 Parc Monga, Constantine. This application was returned marked *Constantine Parish Council can neither confirm nor refute the statements made in this application*.

PA23/06787 Mr N.Bowser – Certificate of lawfulness for the existing use of the addition of a glass balustrade to one side of the exiting garage roof – Kara House, 8A Parc Monga. This application was returned marked *Constantine Parish Council can neither confirm nor refute the statements made in this application.*

Cllr Mrs Thomson reported that she and Cllr Painter had attended the recent Community Area Partnership meeting. The business of the day was principally to approve membership of the Funding and Highways sub-groups. However, it was stated clearly that Cormac does not have to be employed as the contractor for work required on the highway: any contractor with a street-works licence may be engaged. Further, Cornwall Council appears to be extending the use of CAP sub-groups: Care and Transport may also become part of the CAPs' duties. Funding for various capital projects is available from two sources

Members noted that

- the somewhat intimidating sign has been removed from the gate at the eastern end of PRoW 13. However, he had now been told of cut branches strewn across the line of the path
- the Fields in Trust/National Playing Fields Association notice need removing from the Recreation Ground
- a complaint from a resident of Vicarage Terrace concerning balls from the Recreation Ground being kicked over the fence and into her garden was noted
- Cllr Mrs Deering reported that she had inspected the cistern in the ladies' loo and had been able to stop the
 overflow
- the making Space for Nature group which is currently caring for the small triangle of grass on Trebarvah Road (near the gate to the zip wire) will be cutting and removing the grass.
