Community Land Trust Update Suzy Currell

Since our open day last September, when we officially introduced the Constantine Community Land Trust (CLT) to the village, much progress has been made, leading towards our eventual goal of building affordable homes for local people. Although housing is perhaps at the core of our mission, given the present need, this need not be the only project developed by a CLT- other possibilities discussed have included affordable small business units and community-owned local green spaces.

Recently, we have identified several prospective sites for housing around the village, have been talking to, and in some cases visiting, other CLTs to gain the benefit of their experience, and we are about to become an official not for profit registered company.

Most of note to the village at large is that we're planning our Grand Launch Event, incorporating our AGM, on the 28th April at the Tolmen Centre, to enrol members and elect a board of directors. This is your opportunity, as a member of your community, to have a say in the future of housing/small business development in Constantine. It only costs a pound to become a voting member and have your opinion heard.

We are inviting nominations for the board of directors, to be elected at this event. Please let us know if you are interested in the positions of Chair, Treasurer or Secretary, or if you know of anyone else who might be. We will need a total of about 5-12 board members.

Pre-School Solar Project - Looking for Lift Off! Robin Curtis

With the sun coming out again, it's time to start making use of it to generate electricity and an ongoing revenue stream to Constantine Pre-School. We have been selected as one of a handful of UK schools in 2015 to be supported by the 1010 Solar Schools Crowdfunding Project.

At the time of the proposed solar farms in Constantine there was a strong preference for solar PV to be fitted on our community buildings. This is our first opportunity to achieve this. The solar panels could be installed tomorrow – the



roof is suitable, there are no planning issues. All we need is funding and the school could join the growing number of roofs in the parish that are already generating clean, renewable electricity locally.

We are immensely grateful to those local businesses that have already responded to our recent appeal. We will be putting your name up in lights on the Crowd Funding web site. If you have been thinking of donating, please do – we would like to generate momentum behind the project.

Any contributions, whatever size, will effectively be turned into a 20 year income for the Pre-School and thus help to maintain this important centre of community life in Constantine. You can contribute as little as £5 at www.solarschools.org.uk/ constantinepreschool, or you can purchase vouchers at the Farmers Market or from any member of the Pre-School team.

If you are one of the many thousands of people who are changing your electricity utility, and you switch to the 100% renewable supplier, Good Energy, who generate Cornish electricity at Delabole, they will donate £50 to this project.

Constantine Literary Pod Welcomes Victoria Glendinning Anne Hussey



On Friday April 10th Constantine Literary Pod will be hosting their Spring Literary Event. Join us downstairs at the Tolmen Centre to hear Victoria Glendinning talk about Anthony Trollope's life and works, with reference to her critically acclaimed benchmark biog-

raphy *Trollope*, first published in 1992, which won the Whitbread Biography Award. The talk will be followed by a question and answer session.

Biographer, critic, broadcaster and novelist Victoria Glendinning is an Honorary Vice -President of English PEN and was awarded a CBE in 1998. She is a Vice President of the Royal Society of Literature and holds honorary doctorates from the universities of Southampton, Ulster, Dublin and York. She is also a regular contributor of articles and reviews to various newspapers and magazines.

Anthony Trollope is, with Dickens, by far the most enduringly popular Victorian novelist. Born in 1815, he was also a Liberal parliamentary candidate, a magazine editor, a traveller, and a devoted friend of Thackeray and George Eliot. Some of his best-loved works, collectively known as the Chronicles of Barsetshire, revolve around the imaginary county of Barsetshire. He also wrote many other perceptive novels on political, social, and gender issues.

W.I. Report - A Crocodile in the Garden Barabara Willoughby

A crocodile - every garden should have one! So said our speaker Colin Andrews of Steeling Nature, a sculptor who arrived with many creations to suit all locations in the garden, or even hanging on the wall. Originally from West Midlands, he worked in engineering crafting in steel for 20 years. He re-located to Cornwall through work five years ago, but was made redundant after one year. Luckily, his wife encouraged him to continue sculpting full time and he is now based at Cury Cross Lanes on the Lizard. There were no crocodiles in the W.I. Hall but there were beautiful "courting" cranes which could bow to each other in the breeze outside, or be nudged surreptitiously by W.I. members as they passed! There were bull rushes, cow parsley, gerberas and skeleton leaves - all larger than life size and made from a combination of stainless steel and mild steel with zinc bases. Some were treated to give different colouration and some left to rust for a natural effect. Members had many questions about his ideas and helped with his concerns on his very first presentation to a group of people (especially the W.I.).

The meeting continued with the selection of one of our members to represent Constantine at the National W.I. Garden Party at Buckingham Palace in June. We also discussed the Royal Cornwall Show, where the competition will be 'A most inspirational woman'. Our next meeting on Monday 13 April will be 'Food furbelows (ornamentation) and etiquette,' with Lesley Robinson, and on Monday 11 May will be LizLiz and J on 'China: Not the Country in Asia.' All our meetings are open to visitors and new members are always welcome - you could be very surprised and very glad you came!

Constantine History Group - WWII in Cornwall Don Garman

Ivor Corkell, a long term resident of Camborne, provided members of the group with a comprehensive history of the impact of the Second World War on Cornwall and particularly in the areas of Falmouth and Camborne. Ivor pointed out that tensions were already high in Europe in the late 1920s and that two Royal Naval vessels were sunk by the Japanese. Following Churchill's plea for preparations to be made for war in 1935, gun emplacements were constructed along the north coast as this was the anticipated location for an invasion. Members were interested to see that the line of pill boxes encircling Falmouth faced west and north-west to protect the port from this expected direction of invasion.

Once war was declared Anderson and Morrison shelters were made available and the latter were free if your income was less than £250. In the towns community shelters were constructed, proving useful for courting couples, and businesses built shelters for their employees; at East Pool mine a Cornish stamp was converted. Oil tanks were placed under the surface in Swanpool (now being removed to enable house construction) whilst gas masks and ration cards were distributed and train loads of children began to arrive in Cornwall from the cities. Homed by the Women's Institute, most were well treated but some were not, one child being punished by being lowered into a well!


On 3rd September 1939 Falmouth was commissioned as HMS Forte and defence booms, and barrage balloons were soon in place accompanied by restrictions on access to the beaches. The Fal was to see much activity during the war including departure of the St Nazaire raiding party and preparations for D day, whilst in the Helford SOE established a base for clandestine visits to France. A variety of new organisations were established including the LDV (nicknamed Look, Duck and Vanish, later to become the Home Guard), Women's Voluntary Service, Land Army and Air Raid Wardens. Local factories such as Holman's, Climax and Bickford Smiths changed production from equipment for mining to support the war effort.

Cornish airspace became busy as the airfields at Portreath (commissioned in 1941), St Mawgan and Predannack became increasingly active. Ivor showed a map of allied aircraft crashes, which showed concentrations around each of the airfields. Some air crews were lucky to survive. One plane despatched to challenge an enemy aircraft off the north coast had to ditch and resort to the inflatable dinghy. After attempting to swim it ashore, paddles and clothing made a sail. On arrival on the beach a 300 foot cliff then had to be scaled to obtain help for the injured crew member. Pilot and crew both survived. Preparations for D Day saw large numbers of American troops arrive who were constantly on the move for practice. Communities found themselves subject to access controls to their own villages and became aware of segregation between black and white Americans. Some witnessed racial fights in Camborne, whilst in Falmouth the Canadians sought a fight with their north American colleagues!


